"And the man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed or embarrassed."

Genesis 2:25 AMP

Imagine living life with complete openness; being unashamed and fully vulnerable; confident in God's faithful, merciful, loving presence; and trusting one another.

What we have in common is the fear of rejection and a desire to be understood and accepted.

The former is about fear, and the latter is about love.

The reality is that our lives are filled with moments of love and fear, experienced both privately and publicly.

We long to be fully known, but hide because of negative judgments and rejection.

The days when I was most afraid turned out to be my days of deepest growth as I chose courage and vulnerability over fear and rejection.

What made it my most afraid days? Confession of sin (vulnerability) Knowledge of God (responsibility)

As followers of Jesus, we always have access to renewal and refreshing through repentance, returning to God, and receiving forgiveness for our sins.

"Repent, then and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, and that he may send the Christ, who has been appointed for you — even Jesus."

Acts 3:19-20 NIV

Repentance, returning to God, and receiving remission of sins is necessary for experiencing His refreshing presence.

While God's love remains constant, spiritual refreshment isn't automatic.

"Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective."

James 5:16 NRSV

Confessing sins to another person is not for achieving salvation but for attaining healing.

We long to be fully known, but hide because of negative judgments and rejection.

Confession is a radical and revolutionary act against sin, devilish powers, and individualistic Christianity.

Hell sells us this lie and we buy it in bulk -

"Our relationship with God is private and it has no impact on others."

What is confession? "To say the same (as God)."

How do I confess? With Another

Honestly — Humbly — Wisely Consistently — Preemptively

Why confess?

Sin kills — Refreshing — Humility Healing — Intimate Connection

To whom do I confess?

Inward - to yourself
Upward - to God
Outward - to another

How do I respond when someone confesses to me?

Listen — Love them — Be gentle —
Practice confidentiality
Remind them of their Beloved identity
Pray for them — Encourage repentance

What can I expect?

A restful soul.

A grace-empowered life.

Holy living (freedom over sin).

Joyful, grace-based relationships.

Declare over the confessor:

"Because of King Jesus' death on the cross and His resurrection, you are forgiven and free from sin. The blood of Christ cleanses you."

Refreshing is needed until restoration is established.

Take Action

1. Forgive those who have wounded you.

2. Ask a trusted Christian friend to join you in the ministry of confession.
