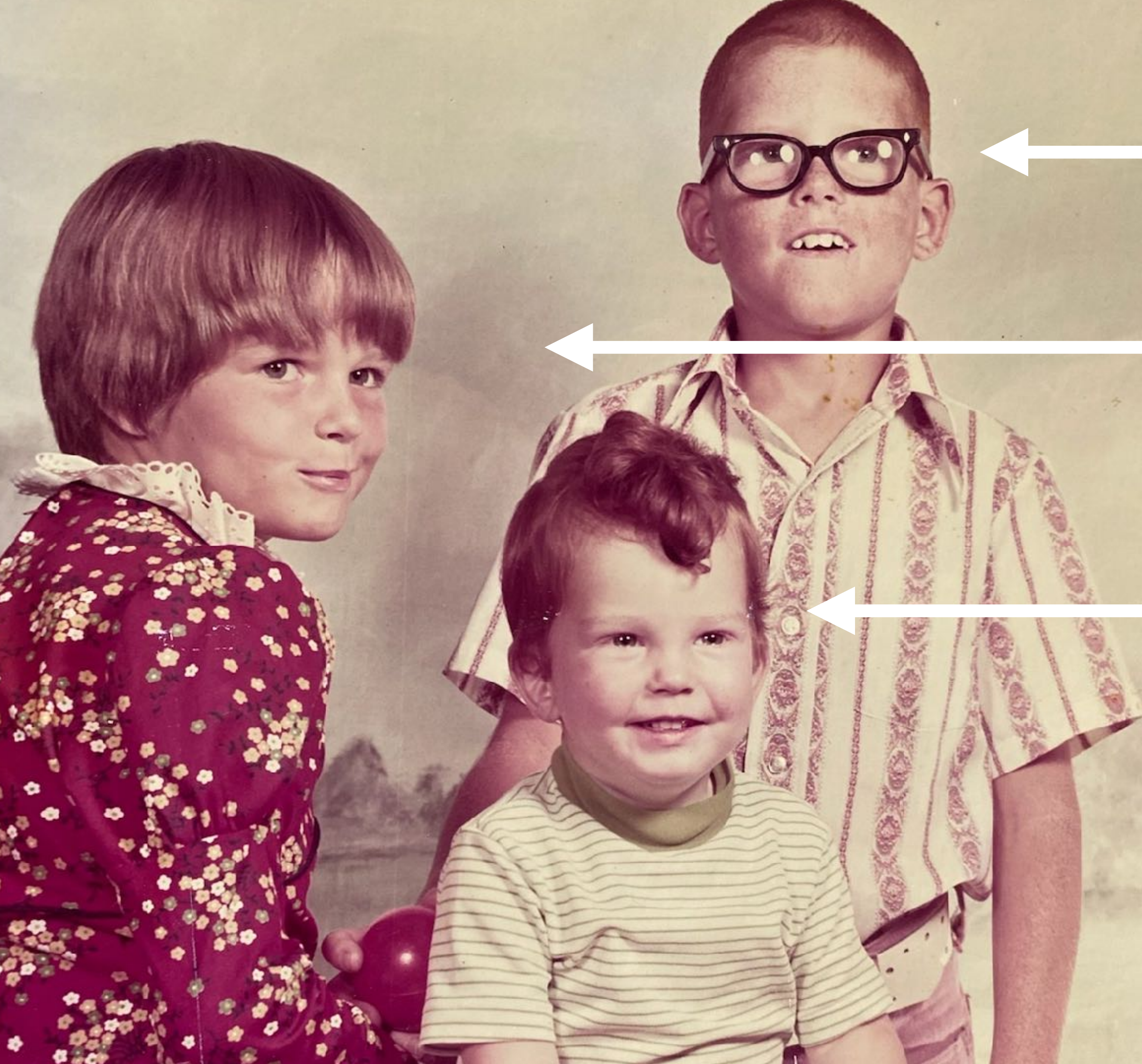



In Genesis 1, we witness the creation of the world and humans, along with God's clear purpose for humanity.

Genesis 1 (v. 26-29)

**Genesis 2 is an account of creation,
but this time, with *Yahweh Elohim (2:4)*,
not just *Elohim (used 32 times in Genesis 1)*.**



In Genesis 2, we discover God's intention for Adam to have a companion, and He creates woman (later referred to as Eve in 3:20).




**In Genesis 2:25, we learn that they lived
without shame and in innocence.**



In Genesis 3:1, we are introduced to the serpent, who is described as “*more crafty than any other wild animal*”.



In Genesis 3:6, the woman encounters three common temptations that all people face: lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, and pride.



In Genesis 3:7, we see that their eyes were opened, and they saw each other in a way they had never seen before.



In Genesis 3:7, sin is introduced into the human story.

“Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned...”

Romans 5:12 NASB1995



**Sin produces death,
so a death is needed to destroy sin.**




In Genesis 3:10, we read about the effects of sin on Adam and Eve's relationship with God.

(Hear God, Fear, Naked, Hiding)




In Genesis 3:11, God asks questions to prompt confession, honesty, humility, accountability, and responsibility.



In Genesis 3:12, Adam fails to meet God's expectations. Instead of taking responsibility, he deflects, blames others, and avoids facing his own actions.



In Genesis 3:13, the woman shifts the blame to the serpent and avoids taking responsibility by not confessing her disobedience.



**Let's pause and ask ourselves, “How is this
*‘good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and
desirable for wisdom’* working out?”**

In Genesis 3:14-19, we hear God declaring five curses:

- 1. The serpent**
- 2. The woman**
- 3. Adam**
- 4. Adam's ability to provide**
- 5. Adam's future (pertains to death)**

**Genesis 3:15 is the first introduction of
King Jesus, the innocent other.**

**(Remember, sin produces death so a death
is needed to destroy sin.)**



In Genesis 3:21, the innocent other is sacrificed so that Adam and Eve can be clothed BY God.

“For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you on the altar to make an atonement for your souls; for it is the blood by reason of the life that makes the atonement.”

Leviticus 17:11

“Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many people; and He will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for Him.”

Hebrews 9:28

Adam and Eve, who were afraid, covered in fig leaves, selfish, and blamed others while avoiding responsibility, were the direct recipients of God's personal, proactive, and powerful provision and love!
