
Five Big Themes:

- 5. Becoming and Doing (v. 10)





My pastoral concern is this - as the family of God, we live permissive, powerless, and passive about sin.




My pastoral hope is that we sustain our humble passion for Jesus and pursue all that God has for us, while maturing into a lifestyle that embodies the fullness of Jesus.



Theme #1: Sin and Death (v. 1,5)


<u>Sin</u>: a power that uses our desires and selfishness for personal pleasure at the expense of others (Psalm 51:4, James 4:17).



Theme #1: Sin and Death (v. 1,5)

Sin: to miss the mark (Romans 3:23, John 17:22, 2 Corinthians 3:18).

<u>Transgression</u>: to take the wrong path; to lose your way; a breaking of relational trust.



Theme #1: Sin and Death (v. 1,5)

- 1. Sin is universal (v. 1,4)
- 2. Sin is active (v. 2)
- 3. Sin is satanic (v. 2)
- 4. Sin is a power (v. 2)
- 5. Sin is condemned (v. 3)
- 6. Sin is deadly (v. 2,5)
- 7. Sin requires justice (v. 3)







Acts 2:38-39 is a solution to sin.

Acts 2:40 underscores the urgency of this message.




